News Flashes

AUGC RESOLUTIONS

The Australian University Graduate Conference has released the substance of resolutions passed at its Annual Meeting on 11-14 February.

Highlights from the Conference include:

- * The graduate bodies of Deakin and Griffith were admitted to membership.
- * An expression of concern was sent to the N.S.W. Minister for Education about the foreshadowed reduction in the percentage of Council members to be elected by Convocation to the proposed restructured governing body of Newcastle University.
- * A decision was made to hold a Workshop in 1984 on alumni relations and fund raising with overseas experts to attend.
- * A call for closer relations between the AUGC and the Australian Vice-Chancellors Committee was endorsed.
- * The production of a national magazine, with inserts made by and for each university for its own graduates was approved of in principle.
- * Member organizations of the AUGC were asked to discuss the impact of lower TEAS values and reduced triennial funding on student attraction, and the flow on effects on university life and educational standards: and that they report back to the AUGC before 1 October, 1983.

SNEDDEN RETURNS FOR VISIT

Former student of Wollongong University, Andrew Snedden, is due in Wollongong for a few weeks holiday. He is well known to Wollongong audiences, and during this time he will give a pianoforte recital at Glennifer Brae - Saturday, 9th April at 8 p.m. (Tickets at Jurjens or at the door performance night - Enquiries phone 297703). His programme will include Mozart's Fantasy in C Minor, selections from Liszt's "Third Year of Pilgrimage", and the four Chopin Ballads.

There will also be a performance at the University of N.S.W., Lunchtime, 12th April.

From an early age, Andrew studied pianoforte with Nan Price of Wollongong, augmented by periods with Alexander Sverjensky, Greville Rothon (Munich), Ronald Farren-Price (Melbourne University) and with William Primrose in Chamber Music. He completed his DSCM with the N.S.W. Conservatorium and his BA at Wollongong University, before departing for London in 1980 to further his pianoforte studies with Ruth Nye, a well known Australian performer and teacher. Rothon, Farren-Price and Nye are all themselves pupils of Claudio Arrau.

In 1981 Andrew was admitted to York University, and has since completed his M.A. (Music) and has commenced work towards a D.Phil. He is engaged to instruct Pianoforte students at York University and will return there in mid-April.

His brief holiday in Wollongong was prompted by the forthcoming marriage of his sister, Anne.

OPERA SINGER TO VISIT

Soprano Carmel O'Byrne Ferlisi will be visiting the University of Wollongong on Tuesday, March 29, and Wednesday, March 30.

She will present recitals of Italian music in association with the Department of European Languages and the Wollongong Chapter of the Dante Alighieri Society.

Signora Ferlisi was born in Ireland. After University studies there she went to Italy to continue her vocal studies at the Palermo Opera House. As well as performing for the most important concert societies in Italy she has travelled extensively in recent years, singing in a large number of countries.

At 8.00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 29 in the University's Union Hall Signora Ferlisi will present a programme entitled "Puccini's Heroines".

During this she will sing some of the most famous arias from Puccini operas including "One Fine Day" from Madam Butterfly and "They Call Me Mimi" from La Boheme.

On Wednesday, March 30 Signora Ferlisi will present a lecture recital to students in the Performing Arts Course at the Institute of Advanced Education. The programme will be devoted to the history of Italian song.

MUSICA VIVA CONCERTS

The University this year is helping to administer Musica Viva's series of concerts in Wollongong.

The series opens on Tuesday, 12th April with the James Bowman Ensemble at the Wollongong City Gallery. James Bowman is one of the world's most successful opera stars, having performed in every major opera house in Europe and the United States. In Australia he received rave reviews for his role as Oberon in the Australian Opera's production of "A Midsummer's Night's Dream". A few days before the concert - on 6th and 7th April - James will be artist-in-residence at the University, together with lute player Max Hynam.

The concert on 12th April will consist of a programme entitled "Welcome to all the Pleasures". Top violinist John Harding and cellist Nathan Waks will join Bowman and Hynam to complete the ensemble for this outstanding recital.

Other Musica Viva series concerts in 1983 include the Endellion Quartet (1st June), the Sydney String Quartet (16th September) and the Canberra Wind Soloists (15th October).

Subscription tickets for the series are priced \$28 and only \$12 for students, pensioners and unemployed. Each subscription consists of four tickets, which can be used either one per concert or to bring other people to a particular concert, so even if you can't get to all four concerts a subscription makes good sense as you can still use up your tickets by sharing them with friends or family.

Group discounts are also available - and you need only a group of six to qualify - details can be obtained from the Union Office.

Subscriptions and tickets for Musica Viva are available from the Union Office or Jurjens, or from the Box Office at the Art Gallery on concert nights.
